- Decrease in hate crime reporting during the full Lockdown period lower than previous year nationally
- Increase in hate crime as restrictions eased neighbour disputes, public order issues in open spaces
- Death of George Floyd in the U.S and BLM demos in the U.K
- Community tensions in relation to breaches music events, weddings, funerals

WYP Response to Hate Crime

- 8 Hate Crime Co-ordinators BD (2), LD (3), KD (1), WD (1), CD (1)
- Work with Third Party Reporting Centres to raise awareness and encourage reporting – BHCA, CST, TellMAMA, Victim Support, Local Authorities
- Ensure appropriate risk assessments / response using THRIVE and the NDM
- Focus on problem solving and reducing repeat victims / repeat offenders
- Work with Partners to provide appropriate and bespoke support to victims
- Appropriate Training to staff (Call Takers / Frontline Officers) to recognise and respond effectively to hate crime – national recognition
- Use analytics to understand and map emerging trends / hotspots / repeats Hate
 Crime App
- Work with all the Forces in the NE Region to share best practice, provide support and Peer Review
- IAG's and Scrutiny Panels (Police / CPS) legitimacy, critical friends
- Outcomes securing the best outcome for the victim (charge / conviction / uplift, conditional caution, community resolution / restorative justice)
