There are three Senior Responsible Officers for this: Iain MacBeath, Therese Patten (CEO, BDCT) and Dr Richard Haddad (Bradford Care Alliance). The Programme reports into the joint Health and Care Partnership Board.</li> <li>• Aiming to tie in the work of CPs with wider work going on across the District, with Locality.</li> <li>• The Programme has established four workstreams, which can be viewed in the presentation.</li> <li>• Isla asked what the plan is for linking up with Involving People in Communities. Steve has spoken to Victoria Simmons about this and they are working together to make sure there is no duplication.</li> <li>• Mike asked how CPs can be audited as they are at the moment, to check if they are ready for these changes. Steve said the key to this is the development toolkit (see presentation). The aim moving forward is to have a distributed leadership model, with one chief exec from the NHS leading on each particular area (see presentation).</li> <li>• 1% Left Shift: investing 1% of the health budget in prevention interventions. In Bradford 1% would be £10,000,000.</li> <li>• The <a href="#">Bradford District Compact</a>, an agreement between the VCS and public sector, in being renewed.</li> <li>• Moving forward, the Council will publish what tenders are coming up in the next 12 months.</li> </ul>
