BVCSA aims and objectives are to:

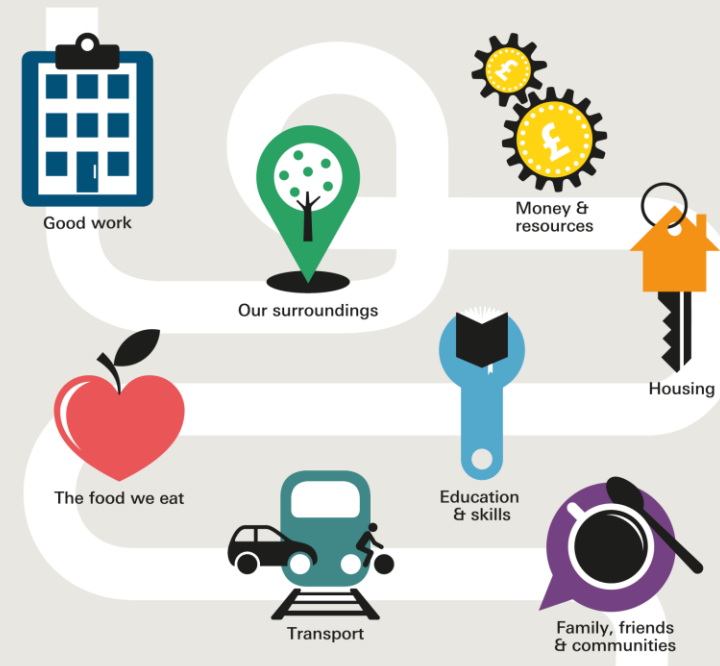
- ▶ Secure funding and investment
Horizon-scanning for funding and investment opportunities.
Proactively engaging with stakeholders for the purposes of:
Identifying gaps and needs.
Identifying opportunities and presenting VCS solutions.
Responding to requests from commissioners and funders to provide high quality solutions through the VCS.
- ▶ Commission VCS organisations to deliver high quality services.
Collaboratively designing service solutions.
Identifying appropriate Delivery Providers, and shaping the delivery model.
Establishing and managing delivery agreements.
Supporting, managing, monitoring and evaluating the performance of Delivery Providers.
Embedding and managing strategic review processes to inform future commissioning.
- ▶ Influencing the strategic environment to ensure effective cross-sector collaboration.
Championing and positioning the VCS within the strategic environment.
Identifying, promoting and ensuring consistent standards of good practice and quality across our Provider Community for the purposes of managing risk
Collaborating in the development of the systems and processes to ensure and effective and consistent commissioning environment.

How the Long Term Plan will change...

Going to your GP

Everyone will have the right to get a doctor's advice online, such as through a video consultation, or an app as an alternative to seeing doctors in person.



Going to A&E

If A&E doctors send you into the hospital for tests or treatment, you should be discharged on the same day, in one-third of cases.

Going to outpatients

More follow-up care from hospital specialists will be done on the phone or online, to help people avoid having to attend in person.



Your care as you get older

There will be more neighbourhood teams of professionals - such as dementia workers, community geriatricians, nurses and pharmacists - working together to support you.

Your chance of heart attack, stroke or dementia

More testing of people's genetics or cholesterol levels, will come in to help prevent 150,000 cases of all three diseases over the next 10 years.



Having a baby

More support will be offered to women with mental health issues and those at risk of premature birth, and all pregnant women will have digital care plans.

Mental health support

Around 345,000 more young people will get help from NHS, school or college support teams, 380,000 more adults will get Talking Therapies and more community care is promised for people with severe mental illness.



Your care if you have a learning disability and/or autism

The NHS will have to carry out more health checks of people with learning disabilities and may have to introduce these checks if you have autism.
