Overview of the Integrated Care System (ICS) – Steve Gascoyne, Senior Head: Strategy, Change and Delivery – Community Partnerships, Bradford and Craven CCG <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Steve's presentation can be found here: https://cnet.org.uk/bradford-district-assembly/health-and-care-forum. Health and Care Bill – will become a piece of legislation. Commissioning: CCGs will not exist after 31 March 2022. Services will move to the Integrated Care System (ICS) at West Yorkshire level. This means the ICS will become a statutory body with a legal status, where at the moment it is a voluntary partnership. ICS includes voluntary sector, health organisations, and local authorities. ICS core team will take responsibility for NHS commissioning.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Integrated Care Partnerships (ICPs) will operate at a local level. They are a partnership of the local authority, NHS, VCS and independent care providers. Subsidiarity: a 'bottom-up', rather than 'top-down' approach. Example - Addressing disparities in cancer screening take-up: need to work at both local and West Yorkshire level to address this. Local engagement is key to learning why people are not taking up the services, and to making the services more accessible. There is a role for Community Partnerships, seen as integral to the way Bradford will operate the ICP – they will look to address issues around health inequalities. Steve mentioned that they have set up a workstream to look at how CPs can be supported to do this. Moving from a competitive to a collaborative approach to funding: Council and NHS meeting to discuss moving this forward. There will be an opportunity for a VCS representative to attend.

The Left Shift: moving resources into the VCS and communities. Airedale Wharfedale Craven (AWC) Health and care Partnership board (H&CPB) has agreed in principle to work with the VCS to shift 1% of their budget to the community via the Community Health Frameworks, from 2022. The 1% is in addition to what the VCS already receives in funding from statutory funding.
