Health & Care Bill – the headlines...


- Reform of Social Care is not included in the Bill
- Collaboration replaces competition
- NHS commissioning arrangements change CCG's will cease to exist and statutory duties will transfer to the ICS (The ICS will become a statutory body)
- Builds on arrangements already in place
- New arrangements to take effect from 1st April 2022

The ICS Model



Four elements:

- The partnership (the whole)
- The ICS Core Team (NHS body)
- Provider Collaboratives (Acute Hospitals and Mental Health Providers)
- Places ICP's (Bradford & Craven, Leeds, Kirklees, Calderdale and Wakefield)






What is our ICP?

Subsidiarity – a key principle...










Health Inequalities are our priority...
